

really saved and really sealed by the way he lives (2 Timothy 2:19).

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An envelope has a seal. The purpose of the seal is to make sure that the contents of the envelope are kept safe and do not fall out, so that the contents can arrive safely at the desired destination.



God has a destination marked out for every child of God, a place "reserved in ______ for you" (1 Pet. 1:4). God will make sure that every believer is delivered safely to his final destination. The Holy Spirit is the "seal," or the guarantee that we will get there.

Every true believer receives the Spirit of God as a sign that he belongs to God and that he will be kept safe by God until the time he receives his glorified body. Just as in legal matters a seal indicates ownership and security, so it does in divine affairs. The indwelling Spirit brands us as God's property (1 Cor. 6:19-20), and guarantees our preservation until the day of redemption (Eph. 4:30).
