- 1) Acceptance. We should not be taken by surprise when God allows us to suffer: "Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you" (1 Pet. 4:12). We need to learn to accept what God has allowed. He is our shield (Psalm 28:7), and nothing can enter our lives unless it passes through Him. "Shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil?" (Job 2:10) The trusting believer can even accept trials joyfully: "Count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations [various trials]" (James 1:2; 1 Pet. 4:13).
