

1 Kings 18:30-39

Elijah was a man of prayer (*James 5:17-18*). "The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much" (*James 5:16*). Such is an apt description of Elijah's power in prayer. When Elijah was on Mt. Carmel confronting the false prophets of Baal he offered a fascinating prayer before providing an unforgettable visual demonstration that Jehovah was the only true God. Consider his four requests:

- F 1) "LORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and of Israel, let it be known this day that Thou art God in Israel" (1 Kings 18:36). First and foremost, he wanted the people to know that Jehovah was the true God. He was not promoting himself but was zealous for God's reputation.
- F2) "That I am Thy servant" (v. 36). He wanted all to know that he belonged to the Lord and was Jehovah's servant, fulfilling His will.
- F3) "That I have done all these things at Thy Word" (v. 36). Elijah was not acting on his own but was faithfully following God's instructions.
- F 4) "That this people may know that Thou art the LORD God, and that Thou hast turned their heart back again" (v. 37). The people would soon turn back to the LORD and declare, "The LORD, He is the God" (v. 39). Elijah wanted people to know that this change of heart in the people was the work of God and He should get all the credit.

Personal Application: Lord, may those around me know that You are the true and living God. May they know that I belong to You and that I serve the one true God. May it be crystal clear whose I am. May they also know that I follow your Word in all things and nothing is more important than obeying the Bible. May their hearts be turned to You, a work that only You can do!
