John 3:1-7, 27-30

There is a little Greek word [<u>dei</u>] which is often translated "must." It means "it is necessary, one must or has to, denoting compulsion." This small word is foundational to certain key doctrines of the Christian faith:

- * 1) The Scriptures must be fulfilled. "All things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning Me" (Luke 24:44). Everything God says must come to pass; His predictions and promises are guaranteed. "Scripture must needs be fulfilled" (Acts 1:16).
- * 2) Christ must suffer, die, and be raised again. "The Son of man <u>must</u> suffer many things...and be killed, and after three days rise again" (Mark 8:31; Matt. 16:21). "Even so <u>must</u> the Son of man be lifted up" (John 3:14). "Ought not Christ [was it not necessary for Christ] to have suffered these things, and to enter into His glory?" (Luke 24:26).
- *3) To be saved a person must believe. Faith is essential. "Sirs, what must I do to be saved? And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved" (Acts 16:30-31). "Without faith it is impossible to please Him; for he that cometh to God must believe that He is" (Heb. 11:6).
- * 4) *The sinner must be born again*. The new birth is essential. Self-reformation will never bring about a new nature. "Ye <u>must</u> be born again" (John 3:7).
- **☼** 5) *The believer must face tribulation*. Such is ours by Divine appointment: "We <u>must</u> through much tribulation enter into the kingdom of God" (Acts 14:22; compare 1 Thess. 3:3-4; John 16:33).
- **☆** 6) *The believer must engage in constant prayer*. "Men <u>ought</u> always to pray, and not to faint" (Luke 18:1).
- *7) The believer must exalt Christ and not self. "He <u>must</u> increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30).
